2024 was Irreducible Grace Foundation's second year in our new home at the Black Youth Healing Arts Center!

It was a year of great learning for all those who came through the doors. Our expanded programming offered the community, and us, so many ways to find joy, seek healing, and grow skills. We expanded from two to five days of weekly offerings such as drumming, cooking, gardening, poetry, dance, and visual arts. As an organization our struggle was how to maintain the sense of community we have had for the past 12 years, when participants now would come to one or two specific programs. Our "Taste of the BYHAC" program has given many a chance to experience more of the offerings, leading to increased multiple day attendees. This program has also been offered externally, receiving rave reviews.

2024 has been a year of great growth that has given us more of a base to build off for 2025! Thank you to all of our young people, staff, partners, funders and donors for your support of our critical work in providing a safe place for BIPOC youth to holistically heal in community!

A New Mission

"Fostering the holistic wellness of BIPOC youth in community."

In 2024, we convened a group of IGF staff, young people, volunteers, and elders to develop our Strategic Plan for 2025 - 2028. In these meetings the team refined the vision and focus of our work for the next three years in addition to developing a new mission and vision statement. Our new mission is "Fostering the holistic wellness of BIPOC youth in community." Through creative and culturally-based holistic programming, leadership & employment opportunities, therapies for emotional healing and housing, IGF will achieve it's mission through supporting BIPOC youth in building the skills to thrive in the world as healthy, well-adjusted adults.

New Programs

2024 brought us new programming at the Black Youth Healing Arts Center that received rave reviews by participants. Having our own space allowed us to have a regular schedule of recurring monthly events including sewing led by Elder Bernice and our very own Dr. D, Tuesday night yoga, drumming with Afro-Boricua artist Tearra Oso, Afro Fusion Dance with Sister Patricia Brown, and Poetry Lab led by St. Paul Central Alum and Pulitzer Prize nominee, Danez Smith. Participants routinely use words such as "healing", "amazing", and "welcoming" when asked to describe their program experience. We also began offering external outreach programming again after a hiatus and are bringing our work to schools, colleges, and corporations. We are proud to be able to offer such needed and affirming programming to our community.

BY THE NUMBERS





IGF's Black Youth Healing Arts Center (BYHAC) is more than a space. It's a center for healing, community, and creativity. In 2024, over 1,500 people visited us at the BYHAC for programming and events.

Our participants come from 59 unique zip codes across Minnesota, with 58% of those residing in the city of Saint Paul.

AGE OF PARTICIPANTS

Our participants range in age from infants to over 60 years old. As in previous years, 18 - 24 year olds continue to be our largest age group followed by 30 - 39 year olds. In 2025, we will be a Frogtown Loop partner site, and providing after school programming for middle and high school students.





RACIAL IDENTITY

Over 64% of those who participate in our programs at the BYHAC identify as Black / African American / African, Over 20% identify as Two or more races.

"IGF taught me how to center my wellness in everything that I do. Taught me how important breathwork is, and grounding myself, and regulating, especially coming from a home where not a lot of people were emotionally regulated. IGF also taught me how to be a better mom, how to go for the resources that will best suit my babies. So, thank you, IGF."

The BYHAC garden grew as we added additional raised beds and apple trees thanks to support from the Minneaota Landscape Arboretum.









20% of participants attended Poetry Lab, our most popular offering in 2024. Drumming was our second most popular with 14% of participants.

In 2024, we held

344

classes, Self Care Sundays, and special events at the BYHAC.



In July, we hosted our first IGF family reunion bringing past participants together to reconnect, share stories, and reminisce about their time with IGF.



2024 IN REVIEW

FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

2024 brought us financial challenges, especially in quarters three and four where we experienced a constriction of funding from grantors and private donors, forcing us to utilize our reserves to pay for programming and general operating expenses. As we enter 2025, we are actively seeking alternative revenue. sources, including earned income through our commercial kitchen and expansion of our external programming outreach team.
